1.1 Resignation of Sri M Chandrakumaran Nair

Owing to health problems, Sri M Chandrakumaran Nair, Vice President, KLA, expressed his desire to step down from the post and, in the last AGM, KLA with great reluctance, had to accept the same. Sri G S Harikumar was nominated as the Vice President in his place and it was unanimously accepted. Sri A Abdunnasar has been elected as the Office Secretary and Smt G S Soudamini has been co-opted as a member of the EC.

1.2 Executive Committee (EC) Meetings

The EC met 9 times during this reporting period. In addition to the normal Executive Committee meetings, several informal meetings of Sub-Committees were also held to discuss various current issues such as CPD programmes, web site updation etc.

1.3 Representation to AICTE, PRC &KTU

KLA, as a professional organization, took up the cause of librarians with UGC and submitted suggestions regarding the status and post of librarian for incorporating in the draft regulations on technical and professional education in AICTE & Kerala Technological University. I am happy to inform you all that KLA's submission has been acknowledged by AICTE and KLA finds a mention in their final guidelines.

Similarly KLA could bring out the conspicuously missing links related to the posts and qualifications of librarians in all the sectors in the state and give a representation to the Pay Revision Commission (Kerala) 2015. Later KLA's representatives could meet the higher authorities concerned and hold a discussion in this regard.

1.4 Membership

As of date KLA has a membership of 1459. In 2014-15, 48 professionals had become members of the Association. This includes 47 Life Members and 1

Ordinary Member. It is notable that the Association is receiving good support from its Regional Committees by way of membership enrolment.

2 ACTIVITIES

- **Workshop on Influential Communication for Young LIS Professionals, 29 August 2014**

There is a constant need to check one's current practices in communication, be it on formal or informal grounds. Behavioral and functional training interventions to a large extent help an individual to acquire a set of best practices and enables one to re-assure self-worth, mutual value, trust and respect in an organization. Keeping this in view, KLA, in collaboration with the Dept of Library & Information Science, University of Kerala, organized a half-day workshop on Influential Communication for Young LIS Professionals on 29th August 2014 at the DLIS Hall, Thiruvananthapuram. The objective of this workshop was to enable students and young professionals to present themselves in public with confidence. The workshop covered topics like Interpersonal Relations, Effective speaking skills, Social and Personal etiquette and Personal grooming. There were about 30 participants and the session was handled by Mrs Sreekala Narendranath, a corporate trainer.

- **Publication of Seminar Proceedings of KLA National Seminar-2013, 17 October 2014**

KLA's new publication, "New Information Technology Interfaces in Libraries & Information Centres" was released by Prof (Dr) Ramesha of Bangalore University on 17 October 2014. The first copy was received by Dr T.M.Vasudevan, Head, DLIS, University of Calicut, who also introduced the book, which is a seminar volume, to the audience. The book has been priced at Rs.600 and KLA offers the same to its members @Rs.420/-.

- **Honoring of Professor M Parameswaran, 30 September 2014**

Kerala Library Association, in association with DLIS University of Kerala organised a function at the DLIS Hall, Kerala University Library building on 30 September 2014 to honour Prof. M. Parameswaran, former Head, Dept. of Library & Information Science, University of Calicut on being awarded the Kendra Sahithya Academy Award for the best Tamil-Malayalam Translation in 2013. Dr. N. Veeramanikandan, Pro- Vice Chancellor, University of Kerala inaugurated the function and honoured the chief guest Prof. M. Parameswaran. Dr M Lalitha, General Secretary, KLA, welcomed the gathering. In his presidential speech, Dr A Gopikuttan, President, KLA, briefly touched upon the literary contributions of Prof. M. Parameswaran. Dr K. P. Vijayakumar, Head, DLIS, University of Kerala and Sri N Sukumaran Nair, former State Librarian offered felicitations and Sri G.S. Harikumar, Vice President, KLA, proposed vote of thanks.

- **Prof K A Isaac Commemoration Lecture 2014, 17 October 2014**

Kerala Library Association held the 9th Prof K A Isaac Commemoration Lecture 2014, at DLIS Hall, Thiruvananthapuram, on 17 October 2014, in a befitting manner. Prof. Isaac's wife, Mrs Chechamma Isaac & son, Prof Kurien Isaac were present on the occasion. Dr M Lalitha, General Secretary, KLA, welcomed the gathering. In his presidential speech, Dr A Gopikuttan, President, KLA, briefly touched upon the significance of the function. Prof (Dr) Ramesha, Bangalore University, delivered the keynote address and started the lecture entitled “Google Generation” by paying as glowing tribute to Prof Isaac., explaining the latter’s relevance in the google generation and his contributions to the library field by way of textbook literature. In the course of his talk, Prof (Dr) Ramesha traced the history of Google. He showed how much it has started influencing the new generation and how the Google generation is different from other generations and also its impact on library & information science. Sri N Sukumaran Nair, former State Librarian, Kerala, had many a vivid memory of Prof Isaac to share with the audience. The various facets of Prof Isaac as a professional, teacher and administrator were brought to life by his vivid portrayal and narration of many anecdotes. It was a fitting tribute paid to a great soul by his former colleague and associate. This was followed by the release of the book, “New Information Technology Interfaces in Libraries & Information Centres” by Prof (Dr) Ramesha. Dr K. P.

2.3 KLA-CPD

In a brainstorming conducted on 2 October 2013 on **KLA 2013-14: A Roadmap**, it was unanimously decided to organize training programmes for working librarians as part of continuous professional development. As a first step towards this a networked computer lab was set up at KLA HQ with Internet facilities, with a capacity to train 10-12 persons at a time. After much discussion a separate team was set up to implement the same. This intensive training centre with all IT facilities was named as KLA Centre for Professional Development (KLA-CPD). KLA's CPD programmes are envisaged as monthly programmes/workshops of short duration, aimed at providing hands-on experience and making the librarians more techno savvy.

Out of the 6 workshops organized in the reporting year, 4 were on KOHA due to popular demand. All the participants were given hands-on training to install and use all the modules of latest version of Koha. Participants were given workshop kit (including software DVD), and a certificate. At the end of workshop feedback was obtained from all the participants in writing.

A total of 75 professionals benefitted from the programmes. Details of the programmes during 2014-15:

2.3.1 Workshops on Managing Literature for Scholarly Writing, 13 July 2014

KLA Centre for Professional Development (KLA-CPD) organized two half –day workshops on Zotero, the most popular reference management software on 13th July 2014. Twenty three research scholars and library professionals from different parts of the state attended the workshop. All the participants were given hands-on training to install and use the latest version of Zotero. They were taught to systemically identify, capture, organize, and use the scholarly literature, and to use the bibliographical information to generate the references /citations and to insert them during the writing process in the required citation style. Participants were given workshop kit (including software CD), and a certificate. At the end of each workshop feedback was obtained from participants who opined that the event was highly beneficial and that it had increased their confidence in using Zotero for managing their references during scholarly writing. Shri V.Sriram, Chief Librarian, Centre for Development Studies, Thiruvananthapuram was the resource person for the workshops.

2.3.2 Workshop on Koha, 8 - 9 November 2014

Eleven library professionals and students from different parts of the state attended the workshop. Shri. Vimal Kumar, Technical Assistant, Mahatma Gandhi University was the resource person for the event.

2.3.3 Workshop on Koha, 13-14 December 2014

The two –day workshop on Koha, the most popular open source integrated library management software was the seventh event under the aegis KLA – CPD. Ten library professionals and students from different parts of the state attended the workshop. Shri Arun V. R, KSCSTE Library, and Shri Ashkar K., Mathrubhumi News Library were the resource persons for the event.

2.3.4 Workshop on Koha, 10-11 January 2015

The two –day workshop on Koha under the aegis KLA – CPD had twelve library professionals and IT Professionals from different parts of the state as participants. Shri Arun V. R, KSCSTE Library, and Shri Ashkar K., Mathrubhumi News Library, were the resource persons for the event.

2.3.5 Workshop on WordPress, 14-15 February 2015

The two –day workshop on WordPress, the world’s most popular open source blogging tool and content management system, organized from 14 -15 February 2015, was the 9th event under the aegis KLA – CPD. Eight library professionals from different parts of the country attended the workshop. All the participants were given hands-on training to login, create id, populate posts and design different types of websites /blogs in WordPress. The participants successfully created blogs and web-sites at the end on two day workshop. Participants were given workshop kit (including user manual), and a certificate. At the end of workshop feedback was obtained from all participants in writing, where they commented that all of them felt the event surpassed their expectations and they were confident about starting new services using WordPress in their institutions. 2.3.6 Workshop on Koha, 9-10 May 2015

This was the 10th event under the aegis KLA – CPD. Eleven librarians and IT Professionals from different parts of the country attended the workshop. Shri Arun V. R, KSCSTE Library, and Shri Ashkar K., Mathrubhumi News Library were the resource persons for the event.

2.4 Library Modernization Projects: KSIDC Project

The Association successfully completed the Library Modernization Project work at the Kerala State Industrial Development Corporation (KSIDC) Library in Thiruvananthapuram in July 2014. A total of 8772 books were technically processed and the database was created. KSIDC's collection included books and reports as well and at any given point of time, a team of 3 professionals were at work.

2.5 KLA Website Updation

KLA's website was updated during this period.

2.6 KLA Newsletter

The Editorial team has been revamped with Dr K G Sudhier leading the team. KLA published the Newsletter, Vols.42 (1-4), 43 (1-4) & 44, Nos. 1&2, for the period, July 2012- December 2014 and the next issue is also ready for release. I am happy to inform you that we have applied for ISSN for the newsletter.

3.1.2 Workshop on Managing Literature for Scholarly Writing, 23 & 30 August 2014

Two successive workshops on Management of Literature in Scholarly Writing were conducted on 23 and 30 August 2014 at St. Berchmans College, Changanacherry and School of Tourism Studies, Mahatma Gandhi University respectively. School of Tourism Studies, Mahatma Gandhi University, St. Berchmans College, Changanacherry and St. Stephen's College, Uzhavoor were

the co-organizers of the workshop. The workshop mainly focused on hands-on training in bibliographic reference management using Zotero software.

Rev. Fr. Jose Viruppel inaugurated the workshop at St. Berchmans College and Dr. Robinet Jacob, Director, School of Tourism Studies inaugurated the Workshop at Mahatma Gandhi University. A total of 50 participants including library professionals, research scholars and students from various institutions attended the workshop. Smt. Savithry T.K., Technical Assistant, Sri. Vimal Kumar V., Technical Assistant, Mahatma Gandhi University, Kottayam, and Sri. Jasimudeen S., Librarian, St. Stephen's College, Uzhavoor served as the resource persons for the workshop.

3.1.3 'Reading by e-reading': Talk by V.K. Adarsh, 6 February 2015

A talk on '**Reading by e-reading**' was organized in association with Mahatma Gandhi University Library at MG University Seminar Hall on 6 February 2015. Sri. V.K. Adarsh, popular technology writer, author, columnist and social media evangelist, delivered the talk. He has been writing columns in leading Malayalam dailies, and online media (ബ്ലോഗ് ഭൂമി). Sri. V.K. Adarsh explained various opportunities and challenges offered by new publishing outlets like e-books, blogs and social media to conventional publishers, authors and readers.

3.1.4 Workshop on WordPress, 20-21 April 2015

A hands-on training on WordPress Content Management System was also organized by the Region in association with Mahatma Gandhi University Library on 20-21 April 2015. In this workshop, participants received intensive training on development of custom website and blog with static and dynamic pages from scratch. Sri. S.L. Faisal, Librarian, Kendriya Vidyalaya, Pattom and Sri. Prajeesh Bhaskaran, Technical Assistant, MG University were the resource persons of the workshop.

3.1.5 Seminar on Scholarly Communication and Best Practices in Research, 9 April 2015

A one-day seminar on **Scholarly Communication and Best Practices in Research** was held at St. Berchmans College (Autonomous), Changanacherry on 9 April 2015. Dr. Tomy Joseph Padinjareveetil, Principal, St. Berchmans College inaugurated the seminar. Participants included research scholars, postgraduate students, faculty members and library professionals. Sessions handled by Dr. Job Joseph, Head, Dept. of Commerce, St. Berchmans College (**Principles of effective theses writing**), Smt. 3.1.6 Workshop on Mendeley, 5 May 2015

On receiving a large number of requests from research scholars of the Mahatma Gandhi University, the KLA-Kottayam Region decided to organise a Workshop on Mendeley Reference Management. The workshop was held at St. Berchmans College, Changanacherry on 5 May 2015. Forty two participants including research scholars and faculty members attended the training. Smt. Savithry T.K., Technical Assistant, Sri Vimal Kumar V., Technical Assistant, Mahatma Gandhi University, Kottayam, and Sri Jasimudeen S., Librarian, St. Stephen's College, Uzhavoor served as resource persons for the workshop.

3.1.7 Book release

Rev. Fr. Jose Viruppel, President, KLA Kottayam Region for three consecutive periods and a very active member of the Region retired from service as Librarian, St. Berchmans College on 31 May 2015. KLA Kottayam region published an e-book in honour of Fr. Jose Viruppel. 3.3 THRISSUR REGIONAL COMMITTEE
