From the President's Desk

Librarianship as a profession is concerned with storage, organize and maintenance of books, papers, journals and other non-book materials. The rapid developments in Information Technology brought revolutionary changes in information processing, storage, dissemination distribution and became a key ingredient in bringing-up great changes in over all aspects of society. The advent of Internet has brought a paradigm shift in information usage from the need to know basis - information available when and where you need it. The information professionals are forced to adopt technologies like computing, networks, Internet, digital data etc and getting adapted to the changing environment. An incredible fast progress in information and communication technologies are transforming the information handling and seeking habits of both librarians and users.

The developments such as Networking, electronic publishing, open access, online services, interoperability, web 2.0 and cloud computing etc have again created new and advanced environment in library and information services. The present system is not sufficient to provide proper training to the ever growing number of budding librarians. Therefore many librarians are not able to satisfy the users properly. Ironically many more agencies are ready to take up the task of giving training in librarianship without much infrastructural facilities. But the students those coming out without proper training in the profession are another burden in the field. New self-financing institutions are providing employment to the librarians but very often under paid.

In spite of the initiatives taken by INFLIBNET, NISCAIR, NIC and Refreshers courses provided by universities, more such kind of training programmes are to be conducted both to the library and information professionals as well as to the user.

Hence the main issue before the association is to professionally equip the librarians.. KLA should become a platform to impart training to such areas where the members need assistance. Association is planning to conduct a series of programmes to justify the existing need. As a beginning a national level workshop is organized during the first week of September this year. We expect full cooperation from the members to conduct these programmes successfully.

The National Seminar on Content Management and Libraries: New vistas for Harnessing Information was organized by Kerala Library Association and co-sponsored / supported by Raja Rammohun Roy Foundation, Kolkata, Kerala State Council for Science, Technology & Environment, Govt of Kerala and Information and Public Relation Department, Govt of Kerala.

It was aimed at reviewing the current scenario of content management and working out new development strategies for better management of information, be it traditional or digital, ensuring best practices to capture, manage, store, preserve, and deliver. The Three-Day National Seminar was held at Padmam, Auditorium, Institute of Management in Government (IMG), Trivandrum during 14-16 July 2011.



Altogether 152 professionals working in academic libraries, R & D establishments, corporate libraries, public libraries as well as academicians across the country participated in the national seminar. In addition to the inaugural session there were six technical sessions in all, spread over three days. Each session was chaired by an eminent personality in the library & information science field and had a lead paper presented by an expert. A total of 48 papers were presented and at the end of all, there was a panel discussion on repositioning of libraries moderated by Dr. Achuthsankar S. Nair with Prof. C. A. Augustine, Dr. Tapaswi, Dr. M.G. Sreekumar and Dr. Ajayaghosh as eminent panellists.

Inauguration

The Seminar was inaugurated by Dr. Shashi Tharoor, Former Under-Secretary General, United Nations and presently, Member of Parliament, representing Trivandrum constituency. The meeting was presided over by Shri K.M. Chandrasekhar IAS, Vice-Chairman, State Planning Board, Government of Kerala and Former Cabinet Secretary, Govt. of India. Other Invited speakers included Adv. K. Chandrika, the Worshipful Mayor, Trivandrum Corporation and Shri P. Jayarajan, Member, RRRLF Kolkata & Former Country Head, British Council Libraries in India. Shri K. P. Sadasivan, President, KLA, welcomed the distinguished guests and the gathering.

In his presidential address, Shri Chandrasekhar pointed out that one of the biggest casualties of TV is reading. He added that it is very important for the state to expand not merely the physical horizon but also its mental horizon. It was his first public function in Kerala after joining the Kerala State Planning Board. He hoped that the Seminar would lead to significant changes in the approach to libraries.

Dr Shashi Tharoor formally inaugurated the Seminar by lighting the traditional lamp. In his inaugural address, Dr Shashi Tharoor opined that libraries have to expand the range of their resources for knowledge content in various forms to be made accessible. According to him, the library system in the country should be re-designed to cater to the needs of new generation users, considering the impact of internet and other social media technologies on learning and life.

The Souvenir brought out in connection with the Seminar was later released by Adv. K. Chandrika, the Worshipful Mayor of Trivandrum Corporation, and the first copy was received by Shri P Jayarajan. The latter, in his speech expressed his concern over the state of libraries at present but was optimistic that libraries would survive in India. Shri. Jayarajan briefly touched upon the National Knowledge Commission's recommendations with regard to libraries.

Technical Sessions

There were six Technical Sessions in all, spread over three days. These were grouped as:

- i. Content Management and ICT: The Technology Interface;
- ii. e-Resources Management I
- iii. e-Resources Management II
- iv. Content Management and Public Libraries
- v. Capacity Building for Excellence and
- vi. Content Management and Web Technology.

Each session was chaired by an eminent personality in Library & Information Science and/or ICT discipline and had a Lead Paper too presented by an expert. A total of 48 papers were presented. The first session was chaired by Shri Satish Babu, Director, International Centre for Free & Open Source Software (IC-FOSS), Govt. of Kerala and National President-Elect, Computer Society of India. The second session was chaired by Dr. T. A. Abdul Azeez, University Librarian-incharge, Calicut University Library and the Lead Paper was presented by Mrs. P. Nishy, Scientist and Head, National Knowledge Resource Consortium, NISCAIR, New Delhi. Dr. V. Gopakumar, University Librarian, Goa University, chaired the third session and Mrs. Padmaja Muralidhar, Senior Librarian, Nanyang Technological University, Singapore, presented the Lead Paper. Dr. R. Ramasamy, Regional Head, RRRLF, Southern Zone, Chennai, who is very much associated with public libraries chaired the fourth session and the Lead Paper on Public Libraries in India with special reference to Tamil Nadu was presented by Ms. Kamakshi, Library and Information Officer, Anna Centenary Library, Chennai. The fifth session was chaired by Shri. P. Jayarajan, Former Country

Head, British Council Libraries in India & Member, RRRLF Kolkata and Dr. Anandakuttan B. Unnithan, Professor and Head, Postgraduate Programmes, IIM Kozhikode presented the Lead Paper. The last session was chaired by Shri. Ravindran Asari, Former University Librarian, M. G. University, Kottayam and the Lead Paper was presented by Dr. M G Sreekumar, Head, Library & Information Centre, IIM, Kozhikode.

Panel Discussion

The Technical Sessions were followed by a Panel Discussion with the Theme "Repositioning of Libraries". The Session was moderated by Dr. Achuthsankar S. Nair, Director, State Inter-University Centre of Excellence in Bioinformatics, University of Kerala. The panelists representing Content Creators, Content Managers and Content Users included academicians, research scientists and LIS professionals of high repute. They were Prof. C. A. Augustine (YMCA e-Resource Centre, Trivandrum), Dr. M P Tapaswi (NIO, Goa), Dr. M G. Sreekumar (IIM Kozhikode) and Dr. A. Ajayaghosh (Director-Grade Scientist, CSIR & Bhatnagar Prize-Winner).



There were Corporate presentations by three companies of their Products & Services, namely M/s Libsoft, Trivandrum, M/s. Elsevier Publishers New Delhi and M/s. Informatics (India) Ltd., Bangalore. There was an Exhibition of the flagship products & services of a few national and international agencies too to benefit the Seminar delegates.

Best Paper Award

There was a contest for the Best Paper Award from among the Technical Papers presented in the Seminar, excluding the Invited Papers. The Award carried a Certificate and a Cash of Rs.2000/- (Rupees Two Thousand only). The paper presented by Smt. Lovely Susan Varghese, HSP, VSSC, Trivandrum, titled "Documentation and data archival activities using open source software in Human spaceflight programme" was adjudged as the Best Paper.

Valedictory Session



The Valedictory Session held on 16th afternoon was chaired by Shri. Palode Ravi, MLA and Member, RRRLF Kolkata. Dr. K P Vijayakumar, Convener (Seminar Committee) welcomed the gathering. Shri. V. S Sivakumar, Minister for Transport and Devaswom, Govt..of Kerala, inaugurated the Valedictory Session. He stressed the need for improvement of the library system in Kerala in tune with the developments in the Information Technology domain. He offered support from the Govt. of Kerala to KLA for such initiatives.

The Best Paper award was given away by Shri. V. P. Joy, IAS, Secretary, Department of Taxation, Govt. of Kerala and Chairman, Expert Committee on College Libraries (1993) and Expert Committee on School Libraries (2001), Govt. of Kerala. to Smt. Lovely Susan Varghese, the winner.

Dr. M. Lalitha, the Rapporteur General of the Seminar, presented the Report of the Seminar. Dr. A. Gopikuttan, Head of the Department of Library and Information Science, University of Kerala and Vice President, KLA also spoke. Shri. N. Sukumaran Nair, Convener (Event Management), offered the Vote of Thanks.

Minutes of the 40th Annual General Body Meeting held on 28August 2011

1. The Meeting

The 40th Annual General Body Meeting of KLA was held on 28th August 2011 at the KLA Hq. Kairalie plaza, Karamana. P.O, Trivandrum at 3.30 pm. A total number of 43 members attended the meeting. The meeting was presided over by Shri. K.P Sadasivan, President, Kerala Library Association.

2. Welcome

The meeting started with a silent prayer followed by welcome by Dr. A. Gopikuttan, Vice-President, KLA. He congratulated the Association for the continued professional activities of last four decades. According to him, some of the facets in LIS domain are now handled by professionals in other fields and it is mainly due to the reluctance and the inability of the library professionals in managing modern Information Communication Technology applications. This needs to be seriously considered in the future activities of KLA. He highlighted the major activities carried out by KLA during 2010-11 and opined that the recent initiatives showed that KLA is well equipped and capable of conducting any type of capacity building programmes for strengthening library This shall include skill development, professionals. Workshops, Coaching programmes, Training to ensure Best Practices, etc.

3. Presidential Address

- 3.1 In his presidential address Shri. K.P Sadasivan highlighted the activities of KLA under three categories, viz. (i) Achievements, (ii) Partial Achievements and (iii) Failures, The achievements included increase in enhancement of fiscal position, improvement of the quality of programmes, higher visibility of KLA at the national/global level, etc. The partial achievements were related to the various representations given by KLA to the Government and other institutions and organizations on matters related to School Librarians, Issues on direct recruitment of Gr. III Librarians at the Common Pool sector, Appointment of University Librarians in Kerala, Recommendations to the 9th State Pay Revision Commission and rectification of anomalies thereof. He observed that the gap between the top political managers and the bureaucracy on issues related to libraries is widening. Strangely enough, a kind of hide and seek approach is visible in the decision making process of the Government, which is the main hindrance for the achievement of certain goals. The proposal for the preparation of a Manual on Standard Practices, Procedures and Policies for the Management of College Libraries in Kerala and the delay in the publication of KLA Newsletter are the failures.
- **3.2** According to him, the decision-making process be it on major or minor issues taken by KLA was fully democratic in nature. This was all the more important on representations submitted to the Government or other agencies. He urged the professionals to avoid undesirable and unhealthy practices of criticizing the activities of KLA without knowing the real facts. He added that the professionals should not indulge in unhealthy intolerance on career matters be it inter-institutional or intra-institutional.

4. Presentation of **39th AGBM Minutes & the Report of the Year 2010-'11** Then Dr. P. K Suresh Kumar, General Secretary, presented the Minutes of the 39th Annual General Body Meeting held on 25th July 2010, which was followed by the Report of the Activities during the year 2010-11.

5. Presentation of Statements of Accounts & Budget Estimate for 2011-'12

Shri G. S. Harikumar, the Treasurer, then presented the

- (i) Audited Statement of Accounts for the Year 2010-'11,
- (ii) Assets and Liabilities of the Association
- (iii) Audited Accounts of C. A. Augustine-Holy Cross Endowment for the year 2010 11
- (iv) Budget Estimate for the year 2011-'12 and
- (v) Provisional Statement of Accounts of KLA National Seminar 2011. The Treasurer stated that a profit of Rupees Two Lakh is expected from the Seminar.

6. Discussion

This was followed by open discussion on the Report of the General Secretary and the Statements of Accounts presented by the Treasurer.

- **6.1** Shri. K. Balachandran, Regional President of KLA, Ernakulam Region, started the discussion by congratulating KLA for conducting the UGC NET Coaching programme. He said he qualified the UGC-NET only through the efforts of the eminent faculties of KLA. He is now getting UGC scale of pay in CUSAT and he expressed his gratitude to KLA Central Committee for the same. He also asked other UGC-NET aspirants to make use of the facility offered by KLA.
- **6.2** Shri. Sugumaran, Scientist (Documentation), LPSC, Trivandrum stated that if KLA provides the e-mail addresses of LIS professionals, he can take the responsibility of a moderator in a Social Network Forum like Yahoo group for intimating the current updates and opportunities in LIS domain.
- **6.3** Dr. P. K Suresh Kumar, General Secretary, KLA pointed out the widening gap between the income and expenditure of CA Augustine Holy Cross Endowment Account. Since the Expenditure exceeds the income, full amount accrued out of the funds deposited for the Endowment would not be sufficient for the distribution of the Award consisting of a Cash Prize of Rs.1000/-, Memento and Certificate. The General Body entrusted the President KLA to discuss the matter with the CA Augustine Holy Cross Accounts Management Committee consisting of one of the members of

the Endowment Fund, Head of the Department of Library and Information Science, University of Kerala, President, KLA and two others nominated by the Executive Committee of KLA for a permanent solution.

6.4 The General Body then unanimously ratified the decision of the Executive Committee held on 16th June 2011 to defer the date of the 40th Annual General Body meeting from the end of July as normally practiced, to 28th August 2011, owing to the KLA National Seminar scheduled for July 14-16, 2011.

7. Resolutions

7.1 Shri. K. P. Sadasivan, President, presented four official resolutions on the following:

- Appointment of Professionally Qualified Librarians in Govt. and Aided Higher Secondary Schools in Kerala;
- ii. Appointment of University Librarians in all the University Libraries in Kerala, including the Medical University Library;
- iii. Organization of Training Programmes for Working Librarian in Kerala by KLA with the support and approval by the Government of Kerala; and
- iv. Recognizing KLA as an accreditation agency by the Government.
- **7.2** After detailed discussion, the Minutes of the 39th AGBM, the Annual Report, the Audited Statement of Accounts, Assets and Liabilities, the Budget Estimate for 2011-12, the Provisional Statement of Accounts of the National Seminar-2011 and three resolutions listed as (i)-(iii) above, were unanimously approved by the General Body. The last resolution was accepted in principle, but was decided that it needed a thorough feasibility study on the modalities of its structure and implementation.

8. Election of Office Bearers for the Period 2011-13

- **8.1** Dr. A. Paslithil, Regional Director, Sree Sankaracharya University, Trivandrum and former General Secretary, KLA was nominated as the Returning Officer for conducting the Election of the new office bearers. He invited nominations for the various posts.
- **8.2** Shri. Sriram, Chief Librarian, Centre for Development Studies, Trivandrum presented a Panel containing names for all the posts of office bearers. Since there was no other panels, the one presented by Shri. Sriram was unanimously accepted.

9. Vote of Thanks

Dr. P.K Suresh Kumar offered Vote of Thanks. The meeting came to a close at 5.45 p.m.
