# **ANNUAL REPORT FOR THE YEAR 2012-2013**

Dear Professional Partners,

I am privileged to present before you the Annual Report of the Kerala Library Association (KLA) for the year 2012-'13. The reported period, the second half of the tenure of the present Committee, was fruitful with many notable events, apart from the routine activities. The detailed reports of the activities are given below.

# 1. KLA- NIC National Workshop on e-Granthalaya

A Three Day National Workshop on the Library automation and networking software, e-Granthalaya was organized by KLA during 11-13 September 2012, in collaboration with the National Informatics Centre (NIC), New Delhi at the LBS Institute of Technology for Women, Poojappra, Thiruvananthapuram.

The workshop was inaugurated by Dr. M. Wilscy, Professor and Head, Department of Computer Science, University of Kerala, Thiruvananthapuram on 11<sup>th</sup> Sept. 2012. Dr. A. Gopikuttan, President, Kerala Library Association, delivered the presidential address. Shri. Ram Kumar Matoria, Technical Director, National Informatics Centre, New Delhi, in his introductory speech, highlighted various issues related to Automation and Networking of libraries in India. Shri. M. Chandrakumaran Nair, Vice President, KLA, welcomed the participants and Shri. S. L. Faisal, General Secretary, KLA proposed vote of thanks.

The workshop was attended by a total of forty one (41) working library professionals from three states, Kerala, Tamilnadu and Karnataka. The introductory presentation on the need of Library Automation and Networking was followed by hands on sessions on different modules of the software, e-Granthalaya. The entire sessions were conducted by Shri. R. K. Matoria, and assisted by Smt. Neha Waiker, Scientist C, NIC, Trivandrum. At the valedictory function chaired by Dr. A. Gopikuttan, President, KLA, Dr. K. P. Vijaya Kumar, HOD, DLIS, Univ. of Kerala distributed the participation certificates. Two of the participants expressed their views on the software and the Workshop. Shri. S. L. Faisal, General Secretary, KLA proposed vote of thanks.

# 2. Workshop on Information Security Awareness

Kerala Library Association (KLA), in collaboration with the Centre for Development of Advanced Computing (C-DAC), Hyderabad organized a half day Workshop on "Information Security Awareness" at the Lecture Hall, Department of Library and Information Science,

University of Kerala, Thiruvananthapuram, on 1<sup>st</sup> December 2012. Mr. M. Gnana Seelan, Project Engineer, C-DAC, Hyderabad was the resource person. The workshop was inaugurated by Dr. K. P. Vijayakmar, HoD, DLIS, University of Kerala at a function. Dr. A. Gopikuttan, President, KLA presided. The topics covered included internet security, cybercrime/attacks, hacking, malicious software, virus attacks, antivirus, privacy on social networks, etc. Sixty professionals attended in the workshop from Kerala and Tamil Nadu. Participation certificates were distributed by Dr. K. P. Vijayakuamar, HOD, DLIS, University of Kerala at the valedictory function. Shri S. L. Faisal, General Secretary, KLA proposed vote of thanks.

Isaac Commemoration Lecture, jointly organized by Kerala Library Association and the Department of Library & Information Science, University of Kerala on "New Generation Knowledge Management: A Challenge to Library Professionals" at the Lecture Hall, Department of Library and Information Science, University Library Buildings at 11 a.m. on 20<sup>th</sup> December 2012.

Dr. K. P. Vijayakumar, HoD, DLIS, University of Kerala, presided over the function and Dr. A. Gopikuttan, President, KLA welcomed the gathering. Shri. N. Parameswaran, Former Deputy Librarian-in-charge, Kerala University Library, reminisced about his association with Prof. K. A. Isaac. More than eighty people, including the family members of Prof. Isaac, faculty members, working professionals, students, retired professionals, research scholars and many others attended the lecture programme. # 5. KLA National Seminar-2013 on "New Information Technology Interfaces in Libraries and Information Centres (NITILIC)"

The Two Day National Seminar on *New Information Technology Interfaces in Libraries and Information Centres (NITILIC)* was organized, by Kerala Library Association, supported by Raja Rammohun Roy Foundation (RRRLF), Kolkata and co-sponsored by Kerala State Council for Science, Technology & Environment (KSCSTE), Government of Kerala, during 12-13 July 2013 at the Seminar Hall, Kerala State Science and Technology Museum, PMJ Jn., Thiruvananthapuram. It was aimed at reviewing the current scenario of information technology, new strategies for better management of information, ensuring best practices by fully utilizing the ICT systems.

132 professionals working in academic libraries, R & D libraries, corporate libraries, public libraries as well as academicians across the country participated in the two-day national seminar. Out of which, 80 participants registered through the online registration facility provided on the KLA website. In addition to the inaugural and valedictory sessions there were six technical sessions in all, spread over two days. Each session was chaired by an eminent personality in the library & information science field and had a lead paper presented by an expert. A total of 27 papers were presented on various topics.

The National Seminar was inaugurated by Dr. V. N. Rajasekharan Pillai, Executive Vice-President, Kerala State Council for Science, Technology and Engineering. Dr. A. Gopikuttan, President, KLA welcomed the gathering. The session was presided over by Dr. G. Balamohanan Thampi, Former Vice-Chancellor University of Kerala & President, Kerala State Library Council. In his presidential address, Dr. Thampi stressed the importance of libraries and emphasized the need for library professionals and research community to be well acquainted with the latest technology.

Dr. Rajasekharan Pillai inaugurated the seminar by lighting the lamp in the traditional manner. In his inaugural address, Dr. Rajasekharan Pillai opined that libraries have to expand the range of their resources by fully exploiting the IT to assist in collective learning and social learning. He also emphasized that technology has actually boosted publishing.

The souvenir brought out in connection with the seminar was released by Dr. Rajasekharan Pillai and the first copy was received by Smt. Lalitha Lenin. Smt. Lalitha Lenin, former Head, Department of Library and Information Science, University of Kerala and Dr. K. P. Vijayakumar, Associate Professor& Head, Department of Library and Information Science, University. of Kerala offered their facilitations. The inaugural session came to a close with vote of thanks proposed by Shri. S. L. Faisal, General Secretary, Kerala Library Association.

This was followed by the keynote address by Dr. A. Neelameghan, Former Head, Documentation Research and Training Centre, Bangalore on the topic "Knowledge Management 2.0 in the Inclusive Knowledge Society Environment". It set the tone of the seminar. Dr. Neelameghan outlined the various dimensions of new ICT systems and stressed the importance of their incorporation in the day to day operations of Library and Information Centres. He also explained about the various web 2.0 tools and the need to preserve indigenous knowledge in order to create an inclusive knowledge society.

The technical sessions that followed focused on new ICT systems. The papers presented through six technical sessions were grouped as Web 2.0 Applications in Libraries, Online Resources and Access Technologies, Software Applications for Information Management, Library Designing in the Digital Era, Human Resource Development in Libraries, and Technology interfaces in Libraries.

The first session had five paper presentations and was chaired by Prof. C. A. Augustine (Former Head, Department of Library and Information Science, University of Kerala). Shri. N. Narayanankutty (Scientist SF, VSSC Library) presented the theme paper, where he explained how various Web 2.0 / Lib 2.0 tools can be effectively used to 'inspire patrons' by citing the activities of VSSC Library.

The second session was chaired by Smt. Lalitha Lenin (Former Head, Department of Library and Information Science, University of Kerala) and the lead paper was presented by Shri. K.

Ravindran Asari (Former University Librarian, M. G. University, Kottayam). Shri. Asari traced the history of publishing, digital resources and modern online access technologies.

Six papers were presented in the third session on Software Applications for Information Management which chaired by Dr. K. S. Chandrasekar (Professor, IMK, University of Kerala). The lead paper was presented by Shri. M. Varghese (Former Head, Department of Library and Information Science, University of Kerala), in which he gave a brief overview of different categories of software used for information management.

This fourth session focused on the theme "Library Designing in the Digital Era". Dr. Sreenivasa Raghavan (Professor & Head, Bharatidasan University, Tiruchirappalli) chaired the session and Dr. K. P. Vijayakumar (Associate Professor& Head, Department of Library and Information Science, University. of Kerala) presented the lead paper. The lead paper highlighted the trends in designing of library buildings from the Middle Ages / Renaissance Period onwards, explaining the different stages of changes in designs.

The fifth session was chaired by Shri M. Varghese (Former Head, Department of Library and Information Science, University of Kerala). Prof A. Sreemurugan (Former Professor and Head, Department of Library and Information Science, Madurai Kamaraj University) delivered an inspiring talk on the importance of human resource development activities in libraries.

The sixth session was chaired by Shri N. Narayanankutty (Scientist SF, VSSC Library and presented the lead paper, in which he explained various steps from planning to sign-off involved in implementation of technology in libraries.

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The valedictory session was inaugurated by Dr. Pulapre Balakrishnan, Director, Centre for Development Studies, Thiruvananthapuram. In his address; Dr. Balakrishnan opined that research community and non-library professionals usually take librarians for granted, without understanding the noble work done by them day by day. He was also of the view that government should take interest in modernizing the public library systems with the help of ICT so that common man is greatly benefitted. He also gave away the Best Paper Awards to Ms. Resmi Sara Thomas (*Use of Social Networking Sites by children: An Analysis*) and Dr. Beena S. (*ETDs of the Institutions of Higher Learning in India*). The Awards carried a Certificate and a Cash prize of Rs.1000/- (Rupees One Thousand each).

Shri. V. Sriram, the Rapporteur General of the Seminar, presented the Report of the Seminar. Shri. N. Parameswaran, former Deputy Librarian-in-charge, Kerala University Library welcomed the gathering. The session was presided over by Dr. A. Gopikuttan, President, Kerala Library association. Dr. P. Mohanachandran Nair, Syndicate Member, University of Kerala offered felicitation. The valedictory session came to a close with vote of thanks proposed by Shri N. Sukumaran Nair, Former State Librarian, Kerala.

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There was a poster presentation in connection with the Seminar depicting the history, and activities of the Association, which attracted the delegates.

There were presentations by four corporates, namely M/s Digi Systems, Elsevier Publishers, ProQuest India and Rapid Radio Solutions during the two-day seminar.

The organizing Committee has planned to publish the Proceedings of the National Seminar soon as a volume. The Committee published the KLA Newsletter Vol.41, Nos. 3-4, January 2012- June 2012 in both printed and digital formats. The next issue is under editing. The printed and e-versions of the Newsletter reach maximum number of members.

- i. **KLA-LIS Training Centre:** The centre is proposed as a professional development institute run by utilizing the infrastructure facilities available with KLA to provide training to students and working professionals on LIS skills and technologies (ILMS, Content Management, Networking, Web 2.0, etc).
- ii. **KLA Journal:** Publication of a journal by KLA is under discussion for the last many years and the present Committee could develop a prototype for the same. More work is required to realize the objective.

## 13.Conclusion

We, the State Executive Committee of Kerala Library Association, is happy to state that the reporting period was fruitful in terms of the quantum of professional activities and the extend of reach to the professionals. The membership base has been increasing notably and many young professionals are now coming forward to join the Association.

The main activities during the reported period, KLA-NIC National Workshop on e-Granthalaya, KLA-CDAC Workshop on Information Security Awareness, the Eighth Prof. K. A. Isaac Commemoration Lecture, KLA Gold Medals and Prof. C. A.
